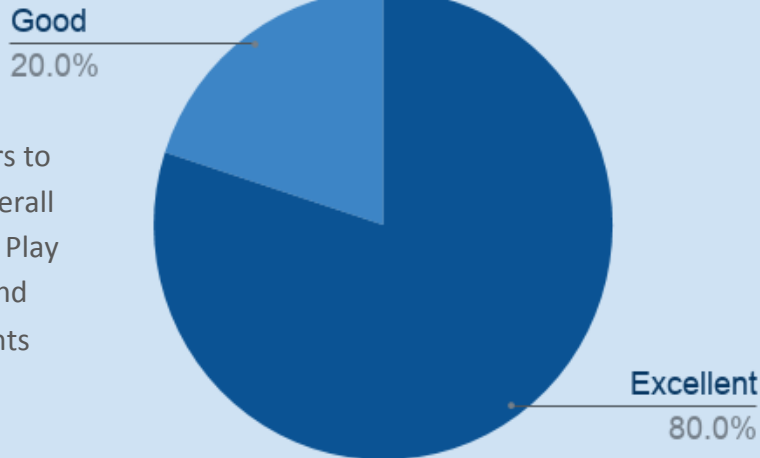


PLAY LEADER TRAINING

Play Leader Training provides an opportunity for KS2 pupils to learn how to lead playground activities for the infants at their school.

Overall Pupil Experience



We asked teachers to rate the pupils overall experience of the Play Leader Training and **80%** of respondents rated it **Excellent**.

"We now have a Play Leader lunchtime club where the children run the club themselves and offer multi sports to Reception, Y1 and Y2."

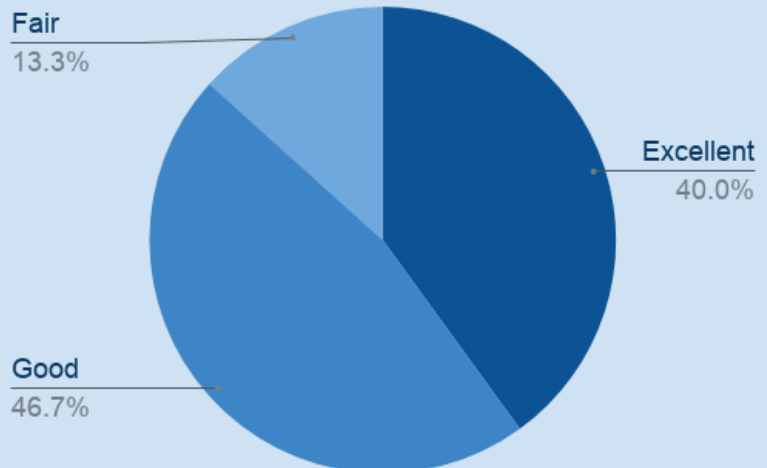

93% of teachers that completed the survey rated the inclusivity of the Play Leader Training as Excellent or Good.

80% of teachers that completed the survey rated the quality of delivery, information and resources of the Play Leader Training as **Excellent**, with the remaining 20% rating it as Good.

Impact of the Play Leader Training on Sport and Physical Activity

We asked teachers to rate the impact of the Play Leader Training on sport and physical activity in their school. Almost 90% of respondents said the training had a Good or Excellent impact.

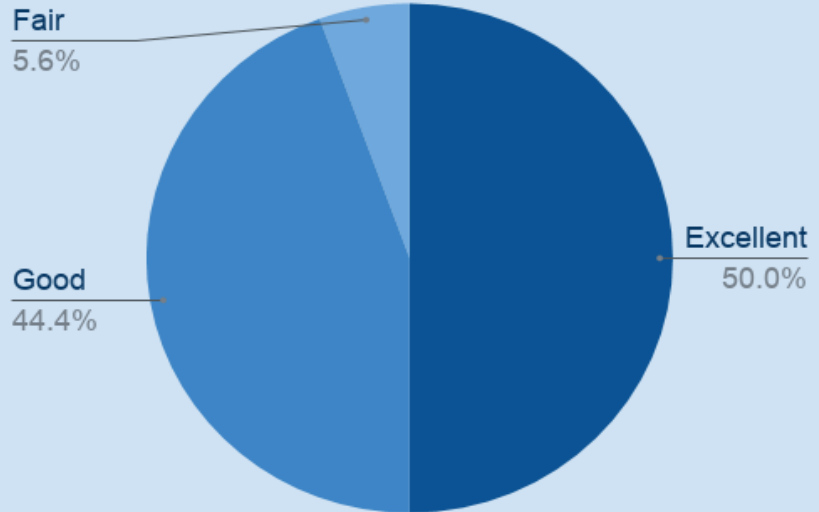
FAMILY FESTIVAL COMPETITION

Family Festival Competitions hosted by Secondary Schools provide the opportunity for whole classes to participate in competitive activity at the inter-school level.

In 2018-2019, over 6200 pupils participated in Family Festival Competitions across the partnership.

We asked teachers to rate the pupils overall experience of the Family Festival Competitions with almost **95%** rating it as **Excellent** or **Good**.

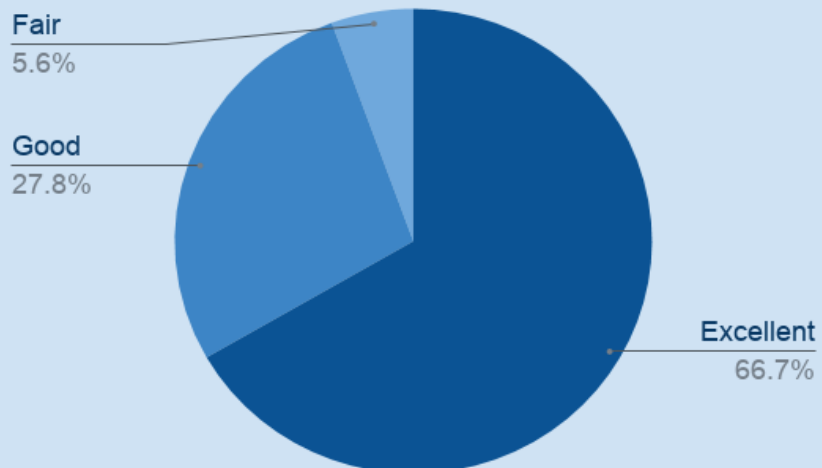

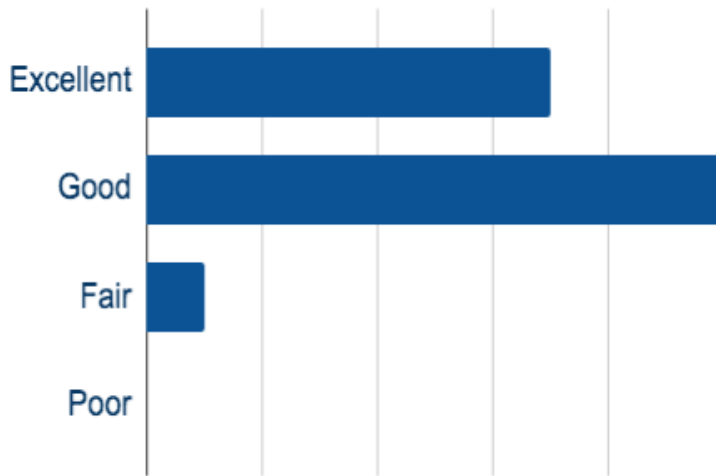


FAMILY FESTIVAL COMPETITION

Family Festival Competitions hosted by Secondary Schools provide the opportunity for whole classes to participate in competitive activity at the inter-school level.

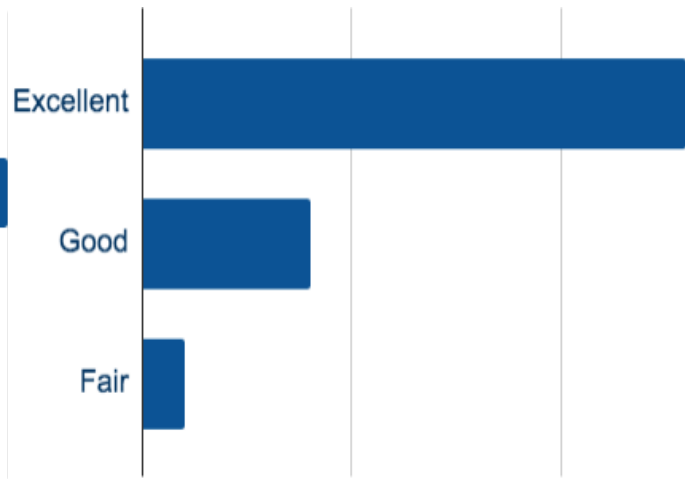
Young Leaders

Almost **90%** of teachers rated the organisation of the family festival events as **Excellent** or **Good**.

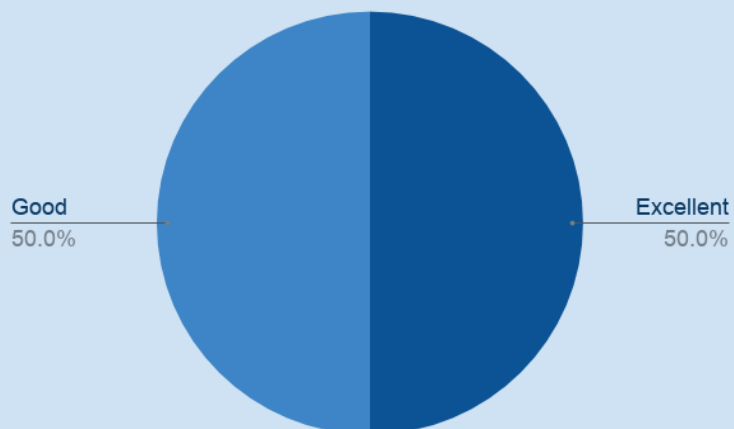
Almost **90%** of teachers rated the accessibility of the venues for Family Festivals as either **Excellent** or **Good**.

We asked teachers to rate the range of sport offered for the Family Festival Competitions and **100%** rated it **Excellent** or **Good**.

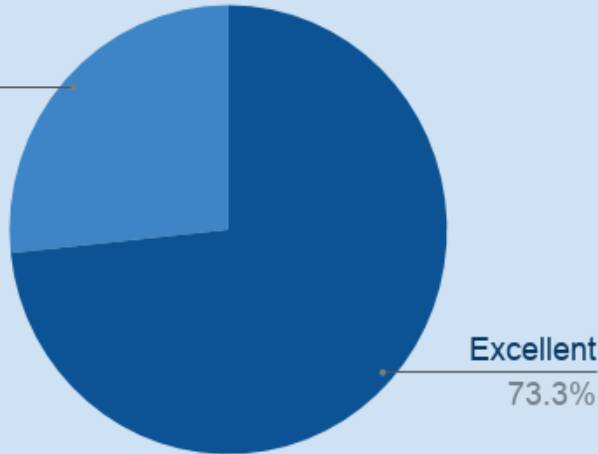


INTRA SCHOOL COMPETITION

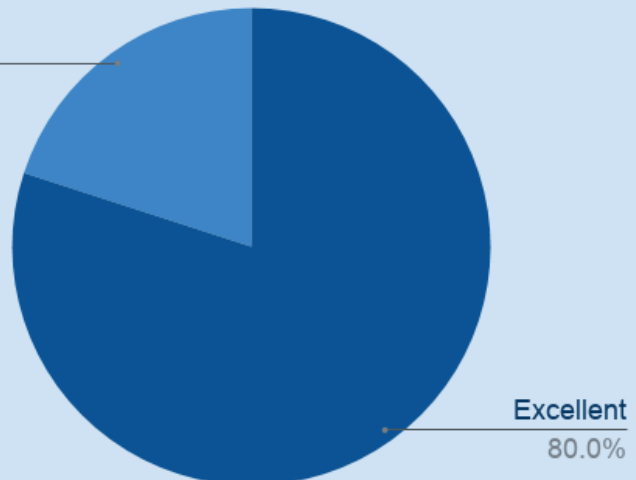

100% of teachers that completed the survey rated the range of sports offered and the inclusivity of Intra School Competitions as either **Excellent** (53% and 60% respectively) or **Good** (47% and 40% respectively).

We asked teachers to rate the impact of Intra School Competitions on sport and physical activity in their school. **100%** of respondents rated an **Excellent** or **Good** impact.

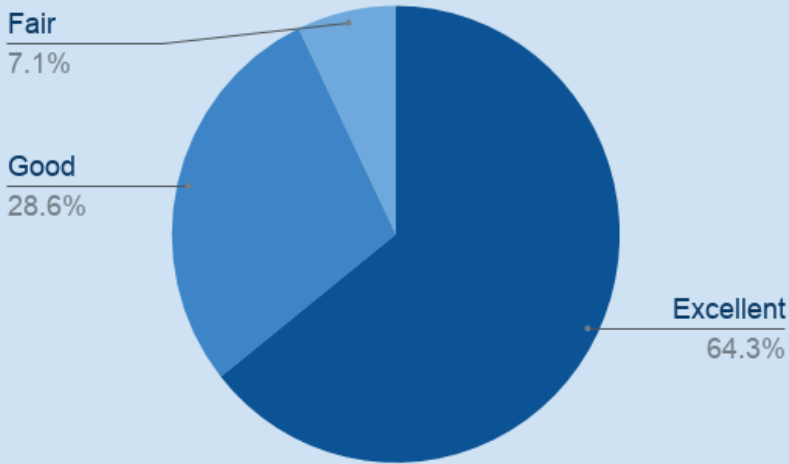

Overall Pupil Experience



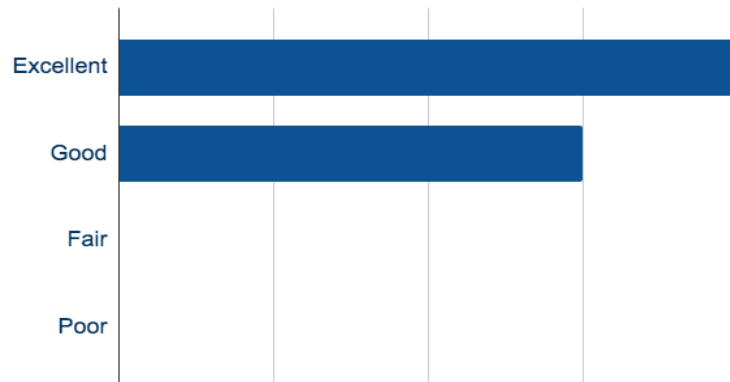
In 2018-2019, we delivered the Healthy Heroes workshop to 1000 pupils from schools across the partnership.

Quality of Delivery

57% of teachers described the quality of delivery, information and resources provided as **Excellent**, while **43%** described it as **Good**.



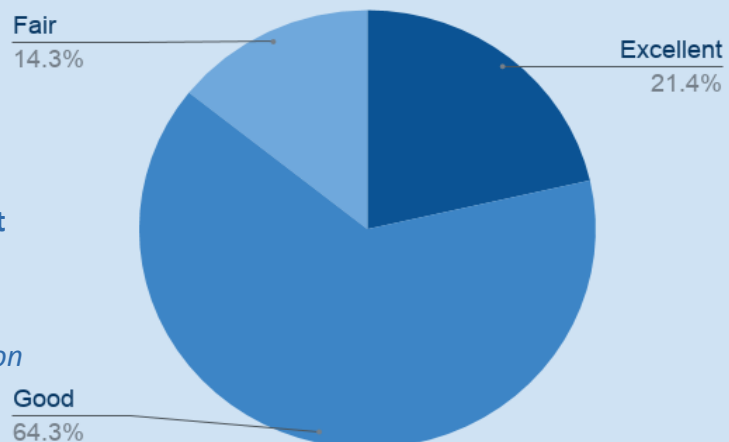
Impact of Healthy Heroes

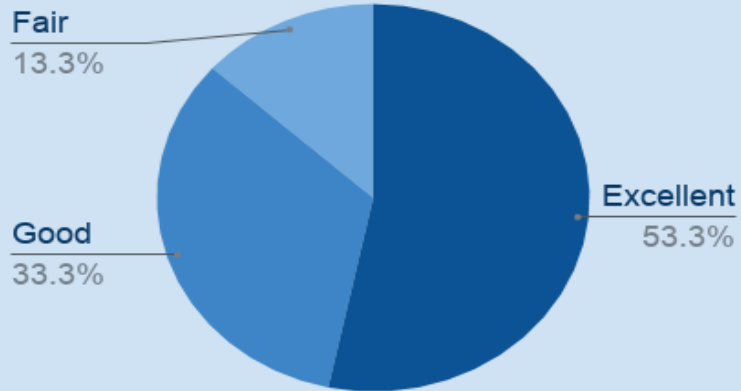
DIRECT ENTRY COMPETITION

The Direct Entry Competitions provide the opportunity for children to compete in small teams at inter-school level with a pathway to county level events.

In 2018-2019, over 1500 pupils participated in Direct Entry Competitions across the partnership.

Overall Pupil Experience

We asked teachers to describe the pupils overall experience of Direct Entry Competitions. **87%** of teachers described their pupils experience as **Good** or **Excellent**.



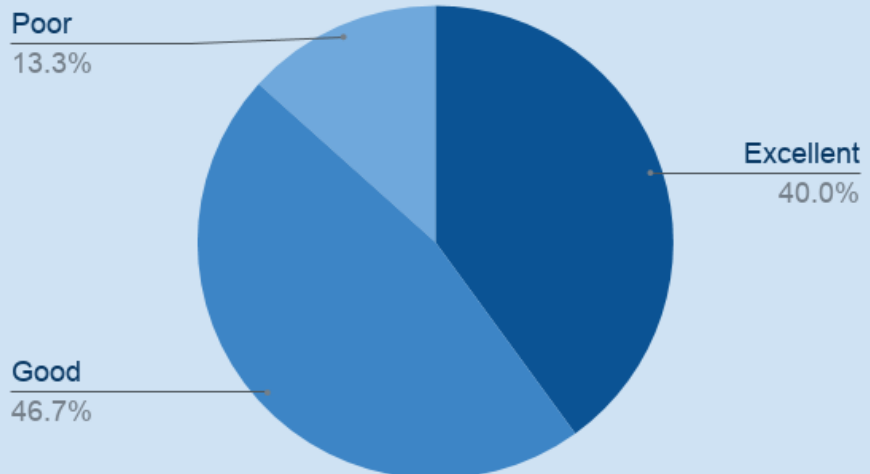

60% of teachers rated the organisation of Direct Entry Competitions as **Excellent** with the remaining **40%** rating **Good**.

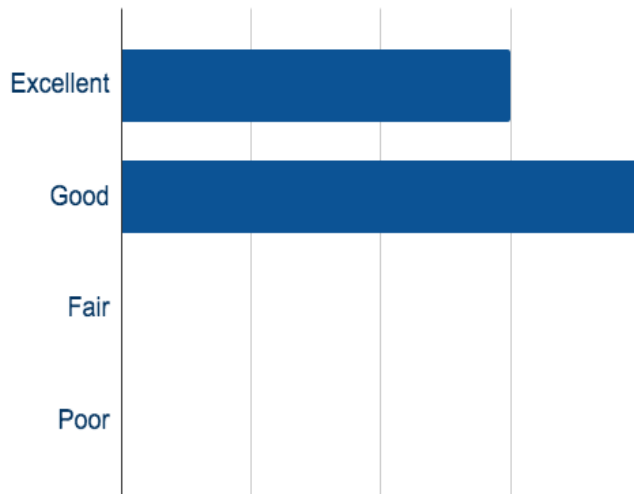

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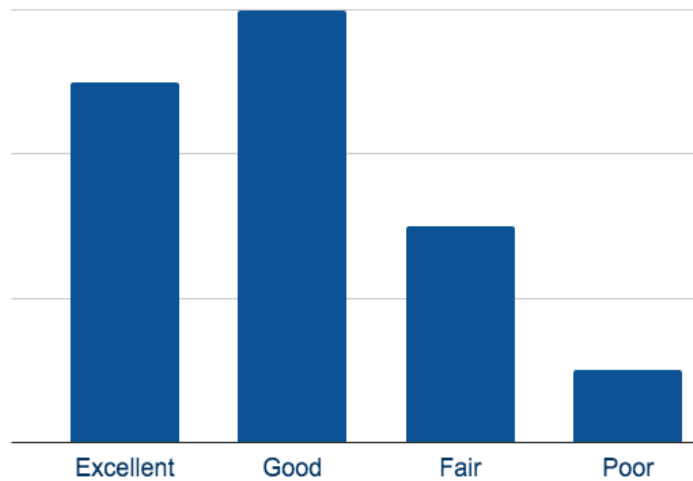
Young Leaders

100% of teachers described the Young Leaders who help deliver the Direct Entry Competitions as either Excellent or Good.

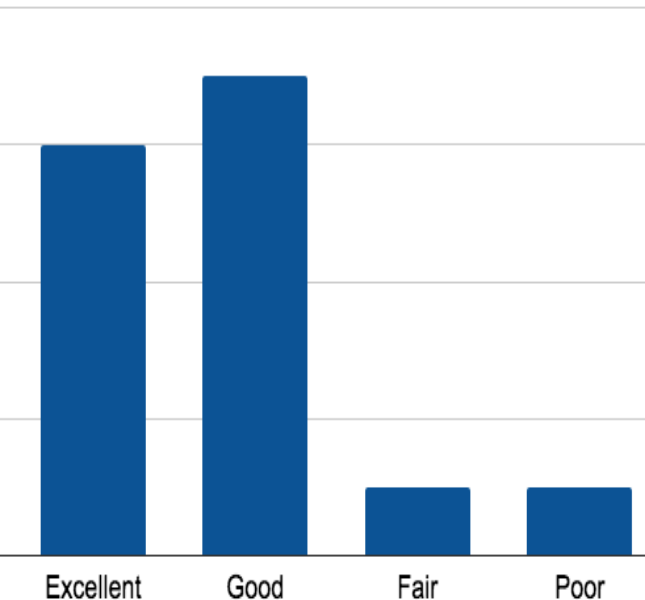


Accessibility

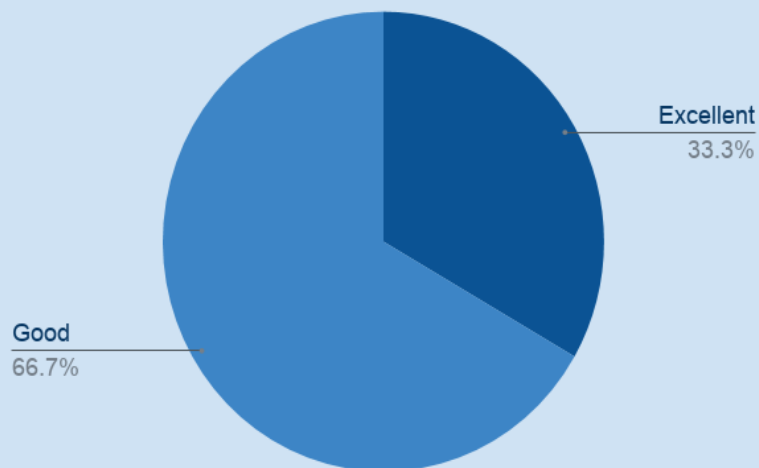
73% of teachers described the accessibility of Direct Entry events as Excellent or Good.

PLAY LEADER TRAINING

- Could there be a mid year check in with the children? Some of them came across difficulties and the opportunity to check in with their trainers might help give the a mid year boost.
- Training at start of autumn term
- Mid year refresher courses

INTRA SCHOOL COMPETITION

- Football, Hockey, Tag Rugby, Gymnastics, Dodgeball, Rounders, Cricket
- More sports for KS2 – Link to direct entry competitions
- Involve the class teachers, so they also develop their coaching abilities for the relevant sport/ activities
- More sessions, so more classes can be included

FAMILY FESTIVAL COMPETITION

- Better preparation before an event and communication with the school.
- It would be good to have more schools in our 'family' to compete against.
- More schools in our Family
- Allowing extra time for the events so children have more opportunities for competitive activities.
- Some lessons or skills children could practice in school before coming up event
- Perhaps Year 6 events could be at the start of the school year, so they wouldn't interfere with SATs
- Offer more for KS1 children
- A generic letter sent out to schools, from the Sports Partnership, for each family festival that includes consent for the trip and for photos to be taken? This could potentially make things easier for schools so we know who can have photos taken and who can't.

HEALTHY HEROES

- Perhaps with a practical element such as food tasting and prepping
- Involve a physical activity task within the workshop
- More sessions, so available to other year groups

DIRECT ENTRY COMPETITION

- We need to actually participate in as a school! We only participate in one so a limited response.
- More sports offered
- Range to include more for Year 3 and 4
- Time is always after school hours
- Not all rules on website were up to date
- More KS1 competitions
- Support in how staff can prepare children for the events during their PE lessons
- Some of the events clashed, I believe basketball with something else. Perhaps more sports offered across the year groups
- Our only issue affecting participation this year was clashes with other school events (e.g: Y6 basketball rescheduled date was on our Shakespeare performance and Key Steps Gymnastics clashes with our parents' evening, etc.)
